## Google Hangouts

For G Suite customers, Google Hangouts Meet allows up to 250 participants on a call, live streaming for up to 100,000 viewers in a domain, and recordable meetings that can be saved to Google Drive.


Part of Office 365, Microsoft Teams is free and gives you and your team the ability to manage workflows, instant message and host team meetings with ease.

## Cisco <br> webex

No-cost WebEx conferencing allows up to 100 participants on one call and enables call in for audio with no time restrictions on calls.

## ZOOM

A Zoom no-cost Basic account lets you host up to 100 participants for 40-minute meetings and one-on-one meetings with no time restriction. You can also use direct and team messaging with Zoom Chat.

A paid Pro account eliminates the time restriction and gives you access to additional features and controls.

## GoToMeeting

The no-cost version of GoToMeeting offers the ability to host 40-minute meetings for up to three participants, including screen sharing, in-meeting chat and mobile or browser-based meetings.
Paid plans offer additional features starting with a jump to 150 participants at the Professional plan level. The Enterprise plan accommodates up to 3,000 participants with no time limits.
